

THE REAL IMPACT OF **PROP RT** ON PEOPLE WITH I/DD

Understanding the Connection Between Tax Policy and Disability Support

What is **Prop RT**

Proposition RT (**Prop RT**) is a St. Charles County ballot measure based on Senate Bill 3 (SB 3). If passed, it could change how local property taxes work in Missouri, reducing future funding for schools, libraries, fire protection, and the Developmental Disabilities Resource Board (DDRB), which supports people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and their families.



The **Negative** Impact on Disability Services

- Local tax revenue could remain flat indefinitely, despite rising costs
- Estimated \$4M reduction in disability service funding over 5 years
- St. Charles County is one of Missouri's fastest-growing counties
- Fewer individuals may receive services due to loss in revenue
- Waitlists and service gaps may increase

An estimated **7,200 people** in **St. Charles County** have an I/DD



Prop RT and What It Means for People with Disabilities

A Yes Vote Means:

Limiting, or reducing funding for county services that support people with disabilities.

A No Vote Means:

Protecting funding for county services that support people with disabilities.

Property Taxes Help Fund Essential Services

- Employment Services
- Therapy and Adaptive Equipment
- Early Intervention for Kids
- Independent Living Assistance
- Family Support
- Community Integration

County voters will decide **Prop RT** on **April 7, 2026**
